On the island of Bali, known worldwide as a paradise for its beaches and perfect climate, ancient temples, and modern resorts, there is also much poverty. This scarcity is a hidden reality and is sadly more evident in the drier, poorer northern regency of Bali called Buleleng. Here children often only finish 6th grade, as their families cannot afford to send them to school to complete their education. This significantly affects their chances to get ahead in life. It impacts their confidence and self-belief and leaves them and their extended family unable to escape living below the poverty line.

THE DESA LES COMMUNITY CENTER

The Desa Les Community Center (DLCC) is a non-profit center aiming to deliver high-quality vocational and life skills training for young people and future generations from low and no-income families.

Our mission is to create opportunities for young people primarily in northern/eastern Bali by providing culinary skills and hospitality management training. The curriculum will also focus on building students' knowledge of important environmental sustainability and local cultural heritage preservation.


Our vision rests in establishing an exemplary platform to provide impoverished youth opportunities to develop

skills that will enable them to raise themselves above the poverty line. They will subsequently build better livelihoods through increased awareness, self-esteem, social skills, environmental consciousness, and self-sufficiency. Ultimately helping them build better lives not only for themselves but also for their families.

THE PROJECT

We are creating an innovative, transformational, scalable, and sustainable community center. The DLCC will prepare young people (aged 15-24) from low or no-income families from the region to capitalize on employment opportunities anticipated from the influx of hotels expected once a planned new regional airport is opened. Employment in the much sought-after cruise industry is also expected. Cruise ship employers provide relatively high income to Southeast Asians, and a skilled workforce from the north of Bali would benefit from access to this.

The land was purchased in 2016 and is located on 4,900 square meters of verdant tropical land full of tropical fruit trees, only 300 meters from the beach. The architectural plans have been drawn up. The center's architectural style will flow with the land by using a gentle and undulating roof where every inch will be used to grow food, scarce herbs. This garden is planned to be used as a revenue generator in the future and a source of key ingredients during the teaching sessions.

This represents a dream to deepen our impact in this community, specifically offering the young people of Desa Les opportunities to achieve a better life by acquiring skills currently missing in the region, ultimately providing them with personal and professional skills that generate vital economic empowerment.
